Description

Anne Frank This card documents the deportation and death of Anne Frank. It is a copy of the original, held by the Dutch Red Cross, and is part of the ITS Holland Wartime Index of 150,000 names. Typical of the cards documenting people detained at the Westerbork transit camp, it contains both biographical detail and notes about the individual¿s wartime experience. The card was created by the administrators at Westerbork, and the Dutch Red Cross probably added the handwritten notations after the war. They indicate that Annelies Marie Frank was transported from Westerbork to Auschwitz on September 3, 1944. The hand-drawn cross inside the open box signifies death. The abbreviation BB 45 refers to Anne Frank¿s death at the Bergen-Belsen concentration camp, during a typhus epidemic, shortly before the end of the war.
